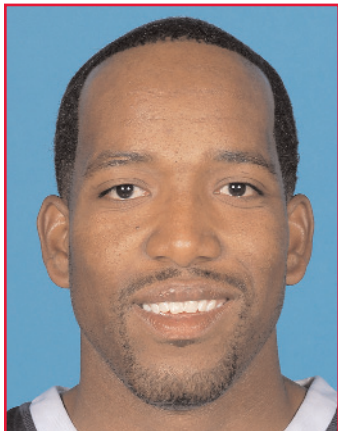


# #8 MICHAEL REDD

Guard \* 6'6" (199 cms) \* 215 lbs. (98 kgs) \* Milwaukee Bucks \* Ohio State University

## USA BASKETBALL NOTES



- Member of the 2007 USA Men's Senior National Team and USA FIBA Americas Championship Team that finished 10-0, won gold and qualified the United States men for the 2008 Olympics. The USA Team was a team comprised of members of USA Basketball Senior National Team program.
- Started once and played in all 10 of the USA's FIBA Americas Championship games. Averaged 14.0 ppg. (fourth high on team),

1.4 rpg., 1.5 apg., 19.9 minutes a game, while shooting 53.0 percent (53-100 FGs) from the field, 45.3 percent (29-64 3pt FGs) from 3-point, and a perfect 9-for-9 from the foul line.

- Scored in double figures in seven of the USA's 10 game. Recorded 23 points (8-10 FGs, 7-8 3pt FGs) in semifinals win over Puerto Rico; Recorded 22 points against U.S. Virgin Islands, 19 points (6-14 FGs, 5-10 3pt FGs) versus Canada, 17 points (7-12 FGs, 4-9 3pt FGs) versus Venezuela, and 16 points (6-10 FGs, 4-7 3pt FGs) against Brazil.
- Played for the USA White Team in the 2007 State Farm USA Basketball Challenge and recorded 17 points (6-14 FGs, 4-10 3pt FGs), and added three rebounds and two assists in just over 20 minutes of action.
- Participated in the July 18-24, 2006, Senior National Team training camp in Las Vegas, but because of personal reasons was not available to play in the World Championship.
- Named on March 5, 2006, to the 2006-2008 USA Basketball Men's Senior National Team.
- Member of the 1999 USA World University Games Team that finished 8-0 and won the gold medal, averaged 6.1 ppg. and 1.3 rpg.

## NBA HONORS

- Named All-NBA third team in 2004.
- Selected one of five finalists for the 2008 J. Walter Kennedy Citizenship Award presented annually by the Professional Basketball Writers Association. The award honors an NBA player or coach for outstanding service and dedication to the community.
- Has played in 2004 NBA All-Star Game and recorded 13 points, three rebounds and three steals in 15 minutes..
- Scored 13 points and added three steals and three rebounds in 15 minutes in his first All-Star Game in 2004.
- Finished runner-up (to Bobby Jackson of Sacramento) in the 2003 Sixth Man of the Year voting.

- Named the NBA Eastern Conference Player of the Month for January 2004.
- Named the NBA Eastern Conference Player of the Week for Dec. 25-31, 2006; Nov. 27- Dec. 3, 2006.

## NBA MILESTONES

- Scored 57 points (18-32 FGs, 6-12 3pt FGs, 15-17 FTs) in the Bucks 113-111 loss to the Jazz on Nov. 11, 2006. His 57 points broke Kareem Abdul-Jabbar's franchise record of 55 set on December 10, 1971, against the Boston Celtics.
- Set the NBA record for 3-point field goals made in a quarter sinking eight in the fourth period versus Houston on Feb 20, 2002, and also shares NBA record for most 3-point shots made in a half (8, versus Houston, 2/20/2002).
- Made 50 consecutive free throws from Feb. 14 to March 1, 2006, and shot an NBA-best 94.6 percent from the free throw line in the month of February.

## NBA NOTES

- Completed in 2007-08 his eighth NBA season, all with Milwaukee.
- Milwaukee finished the 2007-08 season with a 26-56 regular season record.
- Started in 71 of the 72 games he played in 2007-08 and finished the NBA regular season averaging 22.7 ppg., 4.3 rpg., a career high 3.4 apg., and 0.9 spg., shot 44.2 percent from the field, 36.2 percent from 3-point, and 82.0 percent from the foul line.
- Finished 2007-08 ranked eighth overall in the NBA in points per game; 13th in free throws made (402) and attempted (490); 18th in points (1632); 22nd in field goals attempted (1243); 24th in minutes per game (37.5); 27th in 3-point field goals attempted (359); 29th in field goals made (550); 34th in 3-point field goals made (130); 43rd in assists per game; and 44th in free throw percentage.
- Selected after his junior season at Ohio State University by the Milwaukee Bucks with the 43rd overall pick of the 2000 NBA Draft.

## COLLEGIATE NOTES

- In three seasons at Ohio State, compiled 1,879 points to rank fifth in career scoring, tallied 699 field goals made to rank fifth and 149 steals to rank seventh.
- Named Big Ten Conference Freshman of the Year, becoming just the third Buckeye to earn conference Frosh of the Year following NBA player Jim Jackson (1990) and Greg Simpson (1993).
- As a freshman led team in scoring (21.9 ppg), rebounding (6.5 rpg) and steals (2.0 spg).
- Also led the Big Ten in scoring, marking the first time a true freshman has ever led the conference in scoring.

## PERSONAL NOTES

- Born August 24, 1979, in Columbus, Ohio.
- His wife, Achea, gave birth to a son, Michael Redd II, in June 2007.
- Attended Wesy Senior High School (Ohio) and was inducted into the school's Hall of Fame.
- Has hosted over the past six summers the Michael Redd Basketball Camp for Ohio youth.
- Founded the Michael Redd Foundation.
